WHO AND HOW

Older Persons Group to assist older people already being formed. Age Concern North' is assisting with 'Help to go Shopping' service. Other events to follow. Older People's group asks for approval from P.C. Hopes to seek funding to become a project with a part-time worker (possibly with another parish area)
Parish Council to request a Housing Needs Survey to be carried out by the Rural Housing Enabler from the Countryside Agency and ensure that housing needs get mentioned in the Local Development Plan and the Regional Housing Strategy. Options should include low cost homes ownership, part rent and part buy and methods for the community to retain a portion of the equity and or local lettings control, to prevent housing becoming unaffordable to young families and low paid workers. Also to prevent housing going to 'non local' people.
