10. New Planning Applications.

19/02223/FUL: Proposed demolition of existing side extension and construction of two storey side extension, front porch. 1 South Park. applicant Stephen Appleby. Comments by 19 August.

Decisions from Planning:

19/00776/FUL: Stone wall (1.5m high 10m long) on eastern boundary and summerhouse (2.8m x 2.8m) in south east corner of garden. Glen Cottage, Lead Road, Slaley NE47 0BN. Applicant S. Murrell. Highways provided a five-page reply which was circulated. Highways are still talking about a wall on the east and not the west, and generally the Councillors did not feel that a blanked wall of 1.5m x 10m had been considered in situ. This was reported back to the planning officer.

18/03637/FUL: request for the reason why Rose Cottage was demolished and the date lintel of 1842 was removed. Acknowledge by Alex Campbell who has asked the agent telephone her as the demolition of a dwelling is not an extension, even if the gable end has been left standing

19/01522/FUL: Proposed extension of hall to create committee room and storage cupboards. Relocation of WCs adjacent to entrance foyer, widen access to hall. Reconfigure the existing WC area, to include improved access to area through new door opening. Slaley Commemoration Hall. Pat Wilson. **Granted**

12. Defibrillator Update

Cllr J. Storey will report if he has carried out the weekly inspections and that the Defib is working as expected. *See also agenda item 5a.* Cllr J. Storey discovered the Defib missing on 27/7/19, after discussion with R&C Manager, it was discovered that the defib had been deployed on 24/7/19 and needed new pads. Mix up with North East Ambulance Service (neas) who thought that the R&C had responsibility. TW, Manager of the R&C ordered new pads. PC Clerk was told of this on 29/7/19 and contacted Cllr J. Storey with replacement pads. TW contacted neas and reported the Defib back on system. Neas emailed TW a check list and an AED Notification details form. TW, R&C manager reported to Cllr J. Storey that she is pleased that the PC should be restored as the prime contact with her as the second contact. **Is this the right thing to do – it was in 2015? Where should replacement pads be kept? In the safe at the R&C? Should the PC reimburse the R&C for the pads they ordered?**
