Juliet's Wood

A lovely 8-hectare woodland reserve, featuring ancient trees, good bird fauna with species such as tawny and little owl and a wide range of woodland mammals.

Access to Juliet's Wood is along a 1km footpath from Slaley village. The recommended access is from Slaley Village, along a public footpath signposted to 'Marley Cote Walls'

Ladycross Nature Reserve

Ladycross Nature Reserve occupies the exhausted parts of a handworked sandstone quarry that is still active and has produced building, paving, and roofing stone for at least 250 years. The Reserve has been developed over the last 40 years, and since 1997 the Friends of Ladycross community organisation has managed it. It borders on the North Pennines Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty, at a height of about 350m above sea level, with extensive views over the Tyne Valley to the north and Blanchland Moor SSSI on the south. It is surrounded by Slaley Forest, a Forestry Commission commercial and amenity woodland.

St Mary's Church

St Mary's Church lies on a medieval site and was rebuilt in its present form in 1832. It is Grade 2 listed and with its important WW1 memorial windows and lych gate dedication, it is a registered War Memorial, as is the Commemoration Hall.

Services are held at St. Mary's every Sunday at 10.45am, with Holy Communion celebrated on the first Sunday of every month. All are welcome. St Mary's, part of the Moorland Group of Parishes, is Slaley's Anglican Parish Church but since the closure of Slaley Methodist Chapel we also work in friendly partnership with the Methodist Church. Online worship is also available every Sunday on the Moorland Group of Churches Facebook page: https://www.facebook.com/moorlandgroup/All the churches of Slaley unite for Messy Church, a chance for families to have fun Saturday mornings four times each year at the Commemoration Hall.

Slaley Parish Council

Slaley is a Civic Parish of some 750 folk. The Parish Council meets every second Monday of the month and helps to safeguard the well-being of the residents. It supports, through the precept, activities which benefit the Parish.
