5. Recycling update – PG

Need new ideas for recycling as current products like ink jet cartridges ceased. People should be encouraged to take soft plastics back to the major supermarkets.

Corks and blister packs still doing well. Need a volunteer to take blister packs to Superdrug in Newcastle. It was proposed that something to this effect should be advertised parish magazine.
