Strauss Till Eulenspiegel einmal anders Ravel String Quartet Strauss Andante for horn and piano Saint-Saëns Piano Trio in E minor op.92

SATURDAY 26 JULY

WALKING WITH WILFRID

2025 marks the 1350th anniversary of St. Wilfrid's founding of our glorious venue, St. Andrew's Church. In celebration, we present the first concert of the day in magnificent Hexham Abbey and then offer a guided walk to Corbridge. St. Wilfrid sent his monks from Hexham to Corbridge to establish what has now become St. Andrew's. Our walk, organised in partnership with Hexham Ramblers, will be in the company of some of our festival musicians. After tea and cake and time to refresh, our second concert of the day features the world premiere of a specially commissioned work by composer Piers Hellawell which takes inspiration from the very stones of St. Andrew's. A free exhibition of Wilfrid-inspired work by local artist and printmaker, Jo Westgate, completes a day of total Wilfrid immersion.
