Notes from the Vicarage

I am greatly chuffed that New Year's Day falls on a Monday. I shall have a day off and hope that nothing will come between me and the Concert of Viennese music by the city's magnificent Philharmonic Orchestra. The concert is not allowed to finish until there have been two traditional encores. The first is Johan Strauss the Younger's 'Blue Danube' Waltz. It's Austria's unofficial anthem, loved despite the fact the Danube is muddy brown and doesn't really flow through Vienna at all. Never mind, it was written to cheer people up in the aftermath of Austria's defeat in the Seven Weeks' war by Prussia in 1866 – and did the job wonderfully well. It even had words that mocked the economic mess the country had fallen into and its ineffectual politicians.

The words have been forgotten, but the glorious sequence of five of the best waltz tunes ever penned certainly lifts the spirit. Well, it does for me.

We need things like that in the middle of winter, in the middle of tough times now too to help us see a bigger and maybe more hopeful picture.

I honestly believe that the Christmas story serves just the same function. The stories told by Matthew, Luke and John (Mark didn't get in on the act) are richly symbolic. They were never intended to be objective history, but to make us think – and they succeed admirably. They begin with the harshness of our existence and don't try to pretend it away. They affirm that our lives matter, no matter how grim the world may seem to be, and then offer the hope of light shining in the darkness. They dare to suggest that it is in the messy ordinariness of human existence that ultimate truth is found – the truth we call God. They are stories we need as much now as we have ever done.

OK, so you still want to be cheered up? Thinking about waltzes, I rather like this story, said to have been published in the Glasgow Herald:

A prominent politician, invited to an embassy function is supposed to have approached a fellow guest saying (a fairly abysmal chat-up line), 'You are a beautiful lady in scarlet, will you share this waltz with me' 'Certainly not, 'the guest replied. 'First, you are drunk. Second, it is not a waltz, but the Venezuelan national anthem; and third, I am not a beautiful lady in scarlet, but the papal nuncio.'

More than a collection of Photographs" By Sheila & John Moreels M.B.E.

We enjoyed Talk 1 in January 2014, talk 2 in 2015 and talk 3 in January 2016, so after a twelve-month break from giving talks, John and Sheila were asked to come back in January 2018 with talk 4.

If you recall a Heritage Lottery Grant of £26,800 was awarded during 2013 to The Photo Memories Organisation towards the restoring, digitizing and researching the collection of images on glass plates, lantern slides and negatives found in a city attic. The images date from the 1700s to the 1960s.

In May 2014 a website was launched <u>www.photomemoriesarchive.org.uk</u> and a third book, entitled Nostalgic Views of the North was published.

More than 8,000 images are on the website, with plans to add more every month.

John is encouraging people to choose pictures from the website and carry out research, as well as identifying locations and adding their own memories.

A local history display will be available to look over after the Talk.
