## Notes from the Vicarage,

There are times when the beauty of this part of the world is almost heartstopping. As we drove home late on the longest day of the year, the golden light on the distant fells held a magical glow that was at the same time somehow both rich and crystal sharp. As I write this, the intense blue of the sky above Slaley Forest and the contrast with the deep green of myriad shades of green in the middle distance is astonishing. Days like this don't come along often and I want to savour it to the full. Words fail me at times of delight like this, but I find that a deep ache of thankfulness begins to well up and catch me in the throat.

Our ability to use our senses to perceive and respond to beauty is one of the things that makes us human. We may see beauty in one another, in the extraordinary landscape of Northumberland, or even in a carefully crafted glass of wine.

I don't see anything idolatrous in finding delight in nature because it's not nature itself that is the source or object of wonder, but our ability to see it as good. In other words we can see beyond the object itself and respond to it in a way that creates something meaningful to us. We can see it as good, despite also knowing that people, even perhaps those we love, can sometimes be capable of cruelty, that the landscape has been formed by a mixture of life-threatening natural forces and millennia of human toil and sweat. Even a glass of the finest wine is essentially little more than decaying fruit juice.

This ability to see what's around us as good is something the early Hebrew people also attributed to God. In the Genesis stories of creation, as God creates, he sees each stage as good and the whole of creation as very good.

You might, of course, say that such a claim about God is just a human projection, and I couldn't prove you wrong; but I feel deep within myself that the need to be thankful, and our ability to see good even when we know that other things in life can be appalling, is something truly special. If this is what it means to be human, then humans really are pretty wonderful and I can't escape that nagging conviction that the urge to see beyond our selves to something greater, bigger, more transcendent is somehow more than a biochemical accident. But just for now, in the raw beauty of the moment, a feeling of thankfulness and wonder is all that really matters.
