Notes from the Vicarage

On Tuesday 12 June at 7.30pm we greatly look forward to welcoming Bishop Christine, the Bishop of Newcastle, and Paul Dunstan, the Superintendent Minister of the Tynedale Methodist Circuit, to Slaley for a special service at St Mary's to mark the coming together of the folk of Slaley Methodist Church and of St Mary's.

We've been worshipping together now for six months - since the start of Advent - and we seem to be settling down together well. I'm moved and grateful for the very gracious way in which the Chapel folk have already contributed in many ways our common life; and apart from simply swelling the numbers each week, the singing has improved considerably - and that in a church where the faithful few have always sung out better than most.

Our vision is of a church that welcomes and values the contributions of everyone, regardless of the tradition we've each come from, yet which equally values the traditions that have formed us and which we continue to hold dear. We have much we can always learn from one another.

We also need to remember that unity in diversity is not just something we may strive to create, but is a gift from God, a gift that we discover more fully only as we reach out to one another.

I hope that this conviction might give Christian people a special reason to seek unity – and not just in the church; but surely a similar dynamic should apply more generally in human relations, even if we find a belief in God a challenge too far?

Making the effort to reach out to other people and to learn from them can sometimes take an effort, but however demanding it may be, in my experience, it is invariably immensely rewarding. At its simplest it is begins just by taking time for people, which, by the way, is something we do pretty well here.

On 12 June we'll celebrate all that unites us as well and give thanks for the rich diversity of faith and experience that hold dear. Please come and join us for this very special occasion.

This will also give us an opportunity (and there'll be others later in the summer) to explain our plans to purchase the freehold of the land and buildings to secure the shop in perpetuity for the community. We'd like to show you how we hope to adapt the site to deliver the full 500 square feet of retail space that the Plunkett Foundation recommends for community shops, as well as a community cafe that so many local people have asked for. We'll launch a community share offer later in the year and will bring you news of that as soon as we possibly can.
