Slaley gardening column- May 2022- Karen Melvin

"Spring has come again. The earth is like a child who knows poems by heart, oh, many!... Now it seems worth the effort for she wins the prize. When we ask what the green and the blue are, right off she knows every word. Lucky earth," by Rainer Rilke. He also speaks of the white hair of the old man's beard, snow in spring, which we had this year right on top of the daffodils and blossom, which were bowed down under settling snow. Last year there was also snow in April as I was writing the column.

Now the whole garden is plumped up and the trees bursting with shoots, flowers, and fully opened leaves, all of many different shades. As I look over the quarry edge to the lower garden I see the bright apple green of *Malus floribunda*, the purple buds of *Acer Osakasuki*, the copper orange red buds of *Acer Kawakamii*, the ochre yellow of the cut-leaved golden elder, the plummy purple under-leaves of *Rhododendron Wine and Roses*, the creamy pink of *Acer carpinifolium*, and the clear orange stems of a neglected yellow willow. All this so short lived waiting for the leaves to become uniformly green and flowers take over the show. I have loved this slow cold spring, time to notice every little change.



The early cherry blossom has had an extended season and the large wild cherries haven't even started flowering. My best dwarf cherry was an orphan seedling obtained cheaply lacking a label, possibly some kind of *Prunus incisa*. It stands next to the dwarf *Sorbus megalocarpa* (meaning giant seeds) which has early bright red shoots.

The dramatic red flowers of the quince don't mind the cold and have been flowering through the snow. It has been hacked about and severely pruned and remains obliging with its spring show. There was fallen fruit under the plant from last year, from which I could have made jelly.

She has given us, in the best sense a Godly example. And if ever we needed a sign of hope for our times this is surely it.

Our Queen's life has been, in this sense, truly glorious, but if her grandsons are to be believed, those Corgis have made her truly happy. Happy and glorious. She's special alright, but a real person too.

Slaley weather report

At the cost of repeating myself, I can only say that so far, April has again been very dry. I'm writing this on April 20th as we won't be here next week, but the rainfall has only totalled 22.8mm. We're having to water our vegetable garden already. Again, persistent high pressure has confined much of the rain in the west. The two exceptions were April 7th, when we had 7mm and on the 13th, 7.2mm. The April showers in between haven't added up to much and with some moderate winds at times, the small amounts of water won't have done much for the soil. There's not much rain in the forecast either, but easterly winds might mean we see less sunshine than of late.

We have had some lovely spring warmth, but temperatures forecast to be in the mid-teens for the rest of the month are average for the time of year. I just hope there's no more frost.



Summary of progress to date:

Accommodation remains elusive and Vicky and Jacqui have written articles for both the Slaley and Hexhamshire upcoming newsletters, asking for people to contact us if they have any accommodation suitable for our refugee family.

The application form is almost ready to submit (this can happen without accommodation)

Our bank account with Lloyds is now open.

Some of the core group volunteers have undertaken some basic training requirements (Safe guarding).

Northumberland County council have given their official approval for the project

Our fundraising total is now up to c£11,000.

We met with two ESOL (English as a second or other language) teachers last week and they were fantastic. We got lots of information and guidance that will help steer our way when providing the 8 hours a week English teaching required of us by the home office.

We're planning a couple of fundraiser evenings in the village hall. One in early summer, the other in late summer. It's a chance for us all to come together and have a bit of fun -something much needed at the mo. We'll share details as soon as we have them.

When we have cracked the accommodation and the application to the home office has been submitted, we will get in touch with everyone to get all the volunteers organized and prepared to Welcome someone!

Slaley Bowls Club. In March we unfortunately lost by 5 points against Riding Mill. They then came to Slaley in April for a decider as we had beaten them in our first match in December. What a game, the score line was changing hands in every end and went right down to the wire and we lost by 2 points!

Then our thrilling fightback match against Stamfordham. With two games left and 11 points down. We fought back to turn it round and win by 4 points in the end! Our thanks to Riding Mill and Stamfordham for three great memorable matches for 2022.

Large & Small, Small House Gallery North-East and other art work large and small.

Slaley Commemoration Hall Friday May13th 7-9pm and Saturday and Sunday May1st 14-15 11am-5pm

Karen Melvin, Claudia Sacher, Carl von Weiler

This pop-up exhibition in Slaley will feature the very large and the very small, the outside and the miniature. It includes a small shed, a vintage doll house (**Small House Cottage**) and toy garage (**Small House Garage**) part of the **Small House North East** co-curatorial experiment on 'tour' from London to Northumberland. **Small House Gallery** is a mini-contemporary art project for a group of doll's houses, spaces for exhibiting art and playing with scale, curated by **Eldi Dundee** during lockdown.



In the **Small House Cottage** exhibition, **Karen Melvin** has brought the environment into the house, to look at cycles of growth, nature and those large and small issues that go with our concern for a sustainable future. Off-cut pieces of wood were picked up from the workshop floor to paint on and put in the small house next to cut-up bits of exhibition prints folded into tetrahedron shapes. The doll's house is surrounded by painted

table-top arrangements with more offcuts.

Yvette's People- An installation of poetic paper structures by **Claudia Sacher** includes small drawings in a restricted space and larger drawings leaning, hanging, or floating above the floor. The large drawings use previous work so that the paper takes on a weathered aged appearance due to its various incarnations, each incarnation bringing its own gravitas.

Unbird 2022- Within the derelict and abandoned nature of **Mac's Garage (Small House Garage)**, the fuel station, once a symbol of western power and journeying towards personal freedom, becomes a symbol of a broken world. Showing in the back of the garage's sparse workshop and casting an eerie light and sound across the space, is Alfred Hitchcock's classic full length feature film *The Birds*. Here the small dystopian cinema is patrolled and guarded over by life-sized birds made by the artist. For a number of years, **Carl von Weiler** has been making hand-made birds from fragments of recycled materials, sometimes with communities from around the world including groups of migrants who walked from Russia into north Scandinavia in 2014.

Karen Melvin and **Claudia Sacher** last exhibited together in the uninhabited rooms full of the atmosphere of prior lives, in the back wing of Highgreen Manor, Tarsset. **No.3: Stories in a house retold**, part of Varc weekend/ Highgreen Arts in 2018. Karen and Claudia collaborated at Ladycross Nature Reserve in 2019 with **Picnic at Stone Circle** and currently have the exhibition **Breath of My Garden** on at Gibside National Trust, Gateshead.

Un bird 2022 is the first work made by **Carl von Weiler** since his large-scale commission **Tremuseum**, sited by the vast Randsfjorden in Sondre Land, Norway in 2016
