7. Matters for Discussion with County Councillor

a) Cllr J. Storey reported by email 24/10/19 flooding into village residence NE47 0BQ – CC Colin Horncastle was aware of this report and understood that a highways inspector had attended the property. Clerk to ask highways what action had been taken and by whom. Cllr RWH Hutchinson to establish if a report had been filed to the letting agent.

b) Telephone report 5/11/19 to Clerk of Highway blocked drains near Flothers Farm./Bridge - water running into private garage then out into old cundit towards The Pry – a digger needed to unblock. Clerk reported to Glen Harrison. Telephone numbers provided to Highways if more information is needed. Acknowledged. c) Further heavy rain has reopened potholes near Travellers Rest Inn (B6306), near the Ladycross turn off (B6306), Townfoot (Slaley village) C275 corner north bound carriageway – water gushing from underground drain to surface and running down Swang Lane into fields. Between Glen Lodge and Hill Top on the C270 east of Glen crossroads.

d) Cllr S Carson reported that the replacement chevrons for Dipton Cut and the RTA site on Kellas road C265 were on order. The gulley cleaner was needed throughout Tynedale because of the continual heavy rain and consequently the highway drains had not been cleaned at Slaley where a lot of the flood reports had been made.

e) CC C Horncastle reported that the grit heaps would soon be provided - if any known site was missed to contact highways.

f) CC C Horncastle reported that work would soon begin on the A69 roundabout, on the Old Swimming Pool site, on the new High School / Middle School and on a new four-road entry roundabout to the old bunker site where a new supermarket and an hotel would be built – in short we could expect a lot of delays and disruption whilst driving in Hexham.

g) CC C Horncastle asked if Slaley PC had considered developing a Neighborhood Plan? There was Government money available to employ someone to help. Allendale PC with 13 Councillors had completed its NP, and Hexhamshire PC with 12 Councillors was considering a NP. It was further explained that a sub-committee of 5/6 Councillors, several members of the community with input from the school and young people would call public meetings and agree a strategy. *Green Tourism* is very popular. A NP has a life span of twenty-years. Once drafted it goes to the local authority and then a planning inspector for approval before being adopted. It was agreed to invite Jenny Ludman to a spring Slaley PC meeting to hear further what could be achieved for Slaley parish.
