## Climate Change discussions at Open Day January 26th 2020 12 noon – 1 p.m

Working lunch to discuss global warming and actions to be taken by an interparish group with home-made soup, bread buns, Lurpak and a glass of water was served at £5 per head

A mounted display of both the children's work and recent press articles showing how local communities and business are reacting to the global threat. DB provided lots of information of the children's involvement with global warming, plastic overuse, to stop greenhouse gas emissions etc. RD suggested giving monthly plastic free tips in the Slaley News TJ as the Community Shop environment buyer gave some background. PW reported the poor response to the parish Litter Pick organised by the PC since 2004. Litter in the Forestry. Protection of Wildlife at Ladycross. Also the Commemoration Hall was considering an outside tap for people to refill their water whilst walking, cycling or even driving past – cut down by reusing plastic bottles.

DT spoke of more recycling in the parish, especially INSIDE THE Commemoration Hall kitchen which currently has 1 red bin and everything goes into that for landfill. Electric charging points were also discussed SD asked about a possible site for a Community Orchard – government funding was explained – the history behind Juliett's Wood was discussed. SB asked about fertiliser for fruit trees – waste land was often starved of soil goodness for growing trees
