- (i) School meals service: No update.
- (ii) Extra classroom space: Planning permission is needed for the ordered recycled plastic outdoor classroom.
- (iii) Community play & sport facilities on the school field: Clerk is concerned about some splitting of the older Playdale equipment.
- (iv) School Staff: Position of Slaley First School Headteacher is vacant as from July 17th
- d) Support for other public buildings & services:
- (i) Commemoration Hall: The 2015 AGM is scheduled to take place on July 15th.
- (ii) St. Mary's Church with the parish churchyard: Reverend Dr. Helen Savage is writing about wine in the parish news and has a monthly article in the Hexham Courant. The monthly Slaley News also contains "Notes from the Vicarage".
- (iii) Methodist Chapel: No update.
- (iv) Cuts to bus service: Cuts are currently under review and expected due to lack of passengers.
