<u>Slaley Parish Council meetings – Notes from December 2019 and January 2020</u>

The Parish Council met December 9th and January 13th. On both occasions green issues and climate change were raised and during the January meeting it was decided to discuss 'Tackling Climate Change at a parish level' as a matter of routine every month. Several interesting ideas were discussed ranging from school projects through to developing a community orchard. There were wide-ranging discussions concerning the development and funding of the Commemoration Hall, the possibility of a Parish Garden Wander, problems with broadband connections and road safety. There is more detail about all these issues on the Parish website which is regularly updated with PC minutes, news and events (slaley.org.uk).

It was agreed to leave the annual precept at £12,762.

Notes from the Vicarage

Giles Fraser recently wrote a moving and perceptive column in memory of the philosopher Roger Scruton for the website UnHerd.com. In it, he commented on Scruton's idea of loyalty 'to a place and to those with whom you share space as being of supreme value.' He then added that Scruton believed that a fine wine can also express a particularly memorable expression of a sense of place.

As you can imagine, this rang loud bells with me. It's one of the reasons why I love wine so much. It all began on a school trip when I was fourteen when were taken for a wine-tasting to Marc Bredif's cellars at Vouvray in the Loire Valley. I was entranced by the smell and taste of the wines to be sure, but the concurrence of the rock-cut galleries beside the river and the passion of the people who took such a pride in their products all came together in an experience almost like a religious conversion. As Fraser remembers, the French have a special word for this rounded expression of the essence of a place – it's 'terroir.' And a keen sense of terroir suggests that you can only get the fullest possible enjoyment of the wine by relating to the soil it comes from and the people who tend it.

In the churches locally we are just beginning to take part in a major new project funded by the National Lottery Heritage Fund called 'Rural Churches for Everyone.' Its aim is to find new, imaginative and sustainable ways in which our church buildings can be a resource to the whole community. In some places we already have some clues about what we'd like to do: Whittonstall, for example, might become a community space, doubling the functions of church and village hall; Muggleswick might be adapted to also provide shelter for pilgrims on the new trail from Hexham Abbey to Durham Cathedral to be launched this year.

What might happen in Slaley and Healey is less clear. We probably won't be making major changes to those buildings, though St Mary's is certainly overdue a face-lift inside, and we already have some plans in the offing; but whatever we do, in any of the churches, we must make sure we respect it's terroir – that unique sense that this is a place in which the memories, hopes, joys and sometimes sorrows of a community is almost tangibly focused. But the recognition of the supreme value that such places represent doesn't mean that we try to preserve them in aspic. Quite the opposite – like a great bottle of wine they need to be opened and shared as generously as possible. We have quite a challenge ahead of us.


